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BULLETIN 2

1. **EVENTS**

1.1 Athletics, Artistic Gymnastics, Rhythmic Gymnastics and Swimming.

Each country may enter one national boys selection and/or one national girls selection. It is not compulsory to take part in all sports.

1.2 Maximum delegation size is 130 persons, comprising:

- 1 head of delegation.
- 1 assistant head of delegation provided that the delegation will consist of 'athletes and swimmers' or 'athletes and gymnasts' or 'athletes and gymnasts and swimmers'.
- A 2nd assistant head of delegation provided that the delegation is complete (maximum delegation size).
- 1 doctor provided that the delegation comprises at least 60 persons.
- 1 physiotherapist provided that the delegation comprises at least 60 persons.
- A 2nd physiotherapist provided that the delegation is complete (maximum size).

The maximum numbers for each sport and the number of accompanying staff, excluding the above mentioned persons, is as follows:

- Track & Field Athletics: maximum number of athletes: 64
 maximum number of coaches : 7
- Artistic Gymnastics: maximum number of gymnasts : 10
 maximum number of coaches: 2
 maximum number of judges: 2
- Rhythmic Gymnastics: maximum number of gymnasts: 9
 maximum number of coaches: 2
 maximum number of judges: 1
- Swimming: maximum number of swimmers : 24
 maximum number of coaches : 3

For details see Bulletin 1 (about numbers) and Bulletin 2 / item 9.

2. DATES

- 2.1 Delegations will arrive in **Athens** on 26th June 2006.
- 2.2 Delegations will depart from **Thessalonica** after breakfast on 3rd July 2006.
- 2.3 Delegations who arrive in Athens prior to 26th June 2006 will be charged at the ISF fixed rate of 98 EUR per person, per day for the extra accommodation and meals.
- 2.4 Delegations who stay after breakfast on 3rd July 2006 will be charged at the same rate.
- 2.5 Teams interested in arriving before, or staying after the ISF World Gymnasiade, shall inform the Organising Committee as early as possible.
- 2.6 When the distance between Athens and the capital of a participating country from another continent exceeds 5000 km, the delegation has the right to arrive one day earlier at the normal rate of 38 EUR.
- 2.7 The Organising Committee cannot guarantee the availability of accommodation outside the period of the ISF World Gymnasiade nor for persons who are not part of the official delegation. The Organiser however will be pleased to supply information about alternative accommodation in the vicinity for fellow travellers.

4. **TRANSPORTATION**

- 4.1 The Organising Committee will only be responsible for transport following arrival of delegations at Athens International Airport and all transportation in connection with the event (official journeys).
- 4.2 Teams wishing to arrange other travel not specified in 4.1 will be responsible for the payment of the costs involved.

5. **ACCOMMODATION, MEALS AND SERVICES**

- 5.1 Participants will be accommodated **per sport** in 3 or 4 stars hotels as near as possible to the sports venues.

Accommodation will be in 3 or 4 bedded rooms. Assistant Heads of delegation, coaches and judges will be accommodated in twin bedded rooms. Heads of delegation will be accommodated in single rooms.

- 5.2 Meals will be taken at the hotels.

- 5.3 The sports venues are:

Athletics	Kaftanzoglio Stadium - Thessalonica
Artistic Gymnastics	Olympic Indoor Hall - Athens
Rhythmic Gymnastics	Galatsi Olympic Hall - Athens
Swimming	Olympic Aquatic Centre – Athens

- 5.4 A Bank and Post Office is available adjacent to the hotels.

- 5.5 Medical services will be available for participants during the whole period of the ISF World Gymnasiade.

6. FINANCE AND INSURANCE

- 6.1 The Organising Committee is responsible for participants accommodation and meals during the period of the competition and for all technical arrangements in connection with the ISF World Gymnasiade.
- 6.2 The cost of travel from home to Athens and return from Thessalonica is the responsibility of participating delegations.
- 6.3 The payment due to the Organising Committee for each member of the official delegation is 281 EUR per person for a maximum of 130 persons. This is 38 EUR per night for the whole duration of the competition according to ISF rules. An additional fee of 15 EUR per person is levied for ISF funds. (266 EUR + 15 EUR - a total of 281 EUR per person).
- 6.4 The payment for every extra person will be 98 EUR per night in full board. In case a delegation travels by bus, the bus driver will be considered as an official member of the delegation (and will pay 38 EUR per night).
- 6.5 Countries who participate in the team competitions Gymnastics and fail to send an International judge must pay a compensation fee of 823 EUR per judge to the Organising Committee.
- 6.6 The balance of payment can be transferred in EUR to the organiser's account until 26th May 2006 at the latest (bank charges must be paid by the participating countries) or must be paid cash in EUR immediately upon arrival at Athens. Neither bank cards, nor traveller cheques will be accepted!
- 6.7 Any charges or commission deducted from the initial deposit by the bank must be paid by the delegation to the organiser with their final payment.
If you did not pay the deposit yet, you should settle the payment at once!
- 6.8 Each country must have insurance for all members of its delegation. This must cover at least civil liability of the delegation and medical costs.

7. GENERAL

These regulations will apply to and be binding on all delegations participating in this ISF World Gymnasiade.

- 7.1 All participants must give an undertaking to compete against participants from all other countries taking part as requested by the ISF and to take a full part in all the activities.
- 7.2 The Organising Committee will be responsible for the conduct of the ISF World Gymnasiade.
- 7.3 The Gymnasiade will be organised under ISF Regulations and within the Rules of the International Sports Federations concerned under the jurisdiction of the ISF Technical Commissions involved.
- 7.4 The Organising Committee will nominate a Control Commission, a Disciplinary Commission and a Jury of Appeal according to ISF Rules. Their responsibilities will be outlined in Bulletin 3.

8. **PARTICIPATION**

- 8.1 The Head of delegation will act as the official representative of all teams in a delegation.
The Head of delegation or the Assistant head of delegation should be the sole representatives of their delegation in communication with the OC, TC and ISF delegates.
- 8.2 Each delegation participating in the ISF World Gymnasiade must be nominated by the relevant national organisation.
- 8.3 All participants must have the nationality of the country they represent.
- 8.4 All participants must be in full time education at the time of the ISF World Gymnasiade and attending a full time day school in the country they are representing.
- 8.5 Before the start of the World Gymnasiade each delegation must present to the Control Commission:
- ❑ The balance of fees due.
 - ❑ The passport, or any other official identity card, for each competitor bearing the surname and first name of the player, his or her date of birth and nationality.
 - ❑ Individual documents concerning attendance at a school.

9. **ADVANCED NOTICE OF BULLETIN 3**

- 9.1 Entry form Number 3 will be forwarded to participants in due course. On this form you must state:
- a. Name of Country
 - b. School Sport Organisation
 - c. Name of the Head of Delegation
 - d. Names of Coaches
 - e. Names of Participants
 - f. Date of Birth of Participants
 - g. Number of Judges, their Names and their Qualifications
 - h. Names of Additional Persons
 - i. Definite Travel Arrangements
 - j. Dietary Requirements
 - k. Special Requests

Please start to collect this information which will be required by April 2006.

- 9.2 Each member of the delegation will require 2 passport type photographs for use on accreditation cards.
- 9.3 Bulletin 3 will give further information about the social events; the final programme; list of participants and composition of the Disciplinary Commission and Jury of Appeal.

10. **TECHNICAL RULES**

10.1 **Athletics**

10.1.1 Programme:

- Girls: 100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m, 1500 m
100 m Hurdles (0.76), 400 m Hurdles (0.76)
High Jump, Long Jump, Triple Jump, Pole Vault
Shot Put (4kg), Discus (1kg), Javelin (600g), Hammer (4kg)
Swedish Relay (100 x 200 x 300 x 400 m)
- Boys: 100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m, 1500 m, 2000 Steeplechase, 3000 m
110 m Hurdles (0.91), 400 m Hurdles (0.84)
High Jump, Long Jump, Triple Jump, Pole Vault
Shot Put (5kg), Discus (1.5 kg), Javelin (700g), Hammer (5kg)
Swedish Relay (100 x 200 x 300 x 400 m)

10.1.2 Regulations

- All competitors must be born in 1989, 1990 or 1991. Younger or older participants will not be accepted!
- Each country may enter a maximum number of 71 persons: 30 girls, 34 boys and 7 coaches (see bulletin 1 for details on the number of coaches).
- Each country may enter 2 competitors in each event and 1 team in each relay.
- Each athlete may enter 2 events plus 1 relay, except when he/she is registered in a track event over 400 m. In that case only 1 track event may be entered + 1 relay.
- A variety of sports equipment will be supplied by the organising committee except vaulting poles.
- Electronic time keeping with photo finish.
- Competitors' spike shoes must adhere to the regulations set by the stadium (maximum 6 mm).

10.1.3 Progression from 1st round to Finals

- The draw for heats and field qualifying competitions will be the responsibility of the ISF Technical Commission and the Organising Committee with due reference being made to first of all the country and secondly to the times and distances indicated on the entry form.

- Competitions of 100m - 200m - 400m - 800m - 100m Hurdles - 110m Hurdles :

- a) Up to 8 competitors direct to Final.
- b) 9 - 16 competitors : 2 heats with 1st and 2nd in each heat plus 4 fastest losers to the Final.
- c) 17 – 24 competitors : 3 heats with 1st and 2nd in each heat plus 2 fastest losers to the Final.
- d) 25 – 32 competitors : 4 heats with 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each heat plus 4 fastest losers to Semi Final.
- e) 33 – 40 competitors : 5 heats with 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each heat plus 1 fastest loser to Semi Final.
- f) Semi Final : 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th in each Semi Final to the Final.

- 1500 m :

- a) Up to 15 competitors direct to Final.
- b) 16 - 24 competitors : 2 heats with 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each heat plus 6 fastest losers to the Final.
- c) 25 – 32 competitors : 3 heats with 1st and 2nd in each heat plus 6 fastest losers to the Final

- 3000 m :

- a) Up to 19 competitors direct to Final.
- b) 20 – 30 competitors : 2 heats with 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th in each heat plus 5 fastest losers to the Final.
- c) 39 – 57 competitors : 3 heats with 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th in each heat plus 3 fastest losers to the Final.

- Field events :

In all field events Shot Put, Discus, Javelin, Hammer and Jump (Long Jump and triple Jump) the following regulations will apply :

- a) 1-15 competitors : direct to Final.
- b) Over 15 competitors : a qualifying competition according to the following rules :
in the qualifying competition each competitor is allowed a maximum of 3 attempts, if necessary, to reach the suggested minimum. During the technical meeting the rules of qualifying will be set up according to the level of qualifying records.

- Pole Vault :

Boys : this will be direct to the Final with a starting height of 3 m 80cm rising by 10cm intervals up to 4m 80cm and from then on 5cm intervals for the boys.

Girls : this will be direct to the Final with a starting height of 3m 00cm rising by 10 cm intervals up to 3m 80cm and from then on 5cm intervals for the girls.

- High Jump :

Boys : starting height of 1m 80cm rising by 5cm intervals to 2.00m, then 3cm intervals up to 2m 12cm and from then on 2cm intervals.

Girls : starting height of 1m 50cm rising by 5cm intervals up to 1m 70cm, then 3cm intervals up to 1m76cm and from then on 2cm intervals.

10.2 Rhythmic Gymnastics

10.2.1 Programme (corresponding to FIG regulations 2006) and participation:

Each country is authorised to enter gymnasts in the following contests :

- a) Group exercise (5 ribbons):
composition of a team = 5 gymnasts + 1 authorised substitute
- b) Individual contest (ball, clubs, ribbon, rope):
composition of a team = 3 gymnasts
A country is authorised to participate with only 1 or 2 gymnasts but they can only qualify for the finals per apparatus, not for the team ranking.
All individual entries must be done in hierarchical order (in theory the first gymnast registered must be the best one).
- c) Combined contest:
composition of a team = the 5 gymnasts (+1) of the group exercise
+ the 3 gymnasts of the individual contest.

- The composition and the level of difficulty of the exercises must conform to the regulations which are laid down in the FIG Code 2005 for RG (Senior programme).
- Musical accompaniment is obligatory for all exercises:
 - the music must be recorded on CD
 - 1 CD per apparatus / per gymnast
 - 1 CD per group
 - only 1 piece of music per CD
 - all CDs should indicate clearly in writing:
 - the gymnast's name and surname
 - the country
 - the name of the exercise with a symbolic design
 - the duration of the exercise
- The competition order of group or individual exercises and the finals per apparatus will be decided by drawing lots by the President of the Technical Commission in presence of 1 member of the Technical Commission and 1 member of the Organising Committee
- If a large number of participants is registered, the competition will be divided in 3 groups (A, B, C). Group A and B will by priority be composed of gymnasts 1 and 2 of the countries who took part in the previous Gymnasiade. Group C will be composed from countries that did not participate in the previous Gymnasiade and gymnasts 3 of the countries that took part.
- The competition hall will be available to the competitors 36 hours before the beginning of the competition.
- A technical meeting of the team officials will take place two days before the competition.
- An adjoining warm-up gymnasium will be available for competitors on the day of the competition.

10.2.2 Regulations

- All gymnasts must be born in 1989, 1990, 1991 or 1992. Younger or older participants will not be accepted!
- Each country may enter a maximum number of 12 (13) persons : 9 girls, 2 coaches and 1 (2) judges (see bulletin 1 for details on the number of coaches).

- Participating countries must delegate at their own expense an international judge recognised by FIG or, at least, a certificated national judge.
Participating countries may provide, at their own expense, a second judge per team.
A country that registered only 1 or 2 individual gymnasts (without a group) is authorised to participate without providing a judge.
In order to counteract the shortage of judges, the host country can designate a supplementary judge or complete the jury with judges from neighbouring countries.
- The Organising Committee in collaboration with the local gymnastics federation and the Technical Committee ISF will nominate the official jury.
The judges proposed by the participating countries must by priority be designated.
For this reason it is essential that the language(s) spoken by each judge as well as the qualifications of the proposed judges and the dates of their refresher courses will be mentioned on their registration forms.
- Participating countries must hand over, at the accreditation, for each individual exercise or group exercise 20 cards with the “difficulties” and 20 cards with the “artistic value”.
During the official training, not one element of the official cards can be changed.
- The apparatus used will be of a type officially recognised by the FIG and checked by the members of the Technical Committee ISF.

10.2.3 Evaluation System – FIG CODE 1st January 2005

See document “Rhythmic Gymnastics - Evaluation System” enclosed.

10.2.4 Placing

There will be 4 different placings:

- Group exercise placing : 2 performances (20 points + 20 points = 40 points)
- Individual placing on 4 apparatus:
(4 apparatus x 19 points x 3 gymnasts = 228 points).
- Combined placing: 40 points group + 228 points individual = 268 points
- Finals per apparatus : 19 points per apparatus

- The 8 best placed gymnasts on each apparatus in the individual contest, limited to 2 gymnasts per country, shall take part in the finals.
- In case of a tie in points in the individual contest, first the highest score of composition (difficulty + artistic value) will determine the selection. Secondly the highest score for difficulty.
- If the finals are organised at the same time as the apparatus finals for Artistic Gymnastics, only 6 gymnasts shall take part in the finals. The 2 gymnasts that do not participate will be on standby.
- After the apparatus finals, the highest classified group shall give a demonstration.

10.3 Artistic Gymnastics

10.3.1 Programme and participation

The programme (boys & girls) is subdivided into two contests:

a) First contest or all-around competition containing two results:

- *Team results (4 gymnasts perform per apparatus, best 3 scores count)
- *Combined individual results

b) Second contest: individual apparatus finals

- Each country is authorised to enter 1 boys team of 5 gymnasts and 1 girls team of 5 gymnasts.
- The gymnasts of countries presenting less than 3 gymnasts are authorised to take part in the all around competition and individual apparatus finals.

10.3.2 Regulations

- All gymnasts must be born in 1989, 1990, 1991 or 1992. Younger or older participants will not be accepted!
- Each country may enter a maximum number of 14 (16) persons : 5 girls, 5 boys, 2 coaches and 2 (4) judges (see bulletin 1 for details on the number of coaches).
- Participating countries must delegate at their own expense an international judge recognised by FIG or, at least, a certificated national judge.
Participating countries may provide, at their own expense, a second judge per team.
A country that registered less than 3 girls or 3 boys is authorised to participate without providing a judge.
In order to counteract the shortage of judges, the host country can designate a supplementary judge or complete the jury with judges from neighbouring countries.

10.3.3 Evaluation System

- The events will be judged following the FIG Code 2005 modified as follows:

- **MAG**

- Vault: C I (to qualify for C III) and C III (finals):
2 different vaults (also same group), average
- Floor, Pommel Horse, Rings, Parallel Bars, High Bar (C I and C III):
Dismount: no dismount or A dismountaward p. 0.00
 dismount B award p. 0.30
 dismount C or higher award p. 0.50
- Floor exercise:
Bonus for salto connections:

A+B (C, D, E, F)	= 0.10	B, C, D, E, F + A
B+B (C, D, E, F)	= 0.20	B, C, D, E, F + B
C+C (D, E, F) or more difficult	= 0.30	C, D, E, F + C or more difficult

- **WAG**

- Vault: C I (to qualify for C III) and C III (finals):
2 different vaults (also same 2nd flight phase), average
- Uneven bars, Beam, Floor (C I and C III):
Dismount: no dismount or A dismountaward p. 0.00
 dismount B award p. 0.30
 dismount C or higher award p. 0.50

10.3.4 Placing

- Team places are awarded on the results of the points obtained by the best 3 gymnasts on each apparatus on the programme.
Individual all around places are awarded on the total of each gymnast on all apparatus.
- The 8 best placed gymnasts on each apparatus in the first contest, limited to 2 gymnasts per country, may take part in the apparatus finals. In the case of a tie on points in the first contest, regulation will follow the FIG Technical Rules 2005 Artistic Gymnastic (Art. 5.1.6).
3 other gymnasts selected on the basis of the points obtained in the first contest must be ready to act as replacements in case of a withdrawal.
- Tie (ex-aequo): should there be a tie on points in the team championships, the individual all around event or in the apparatus final, the following regulation will apply : «Equal rank for equal performance». The same performance deserves the same ranking, the same title and the same medal. In the case of a tie, the subsequent place will not be attributed.

10.4 **Swimming**

10.4.1 Programme

The programme will include the following events for boys and girls:

Freestyle	50m / 100m / 400m / 4 x 100m
Backstroke	100m / 200m
Breaststroke	100m / 200m
Butterfly	100m / 200m
Medley	200 m / 400m / 4 x 100m

10.4.2 Regulations

- All swimmers must be born in 1989, 1990, 1991 or 1992. Younger or older participants will not be accepted!
- Each country may enter a maximum number of 15 persons : 12 girls, 12 boys and 3 coaches (see bulletin 1 for details on the number of coaches).
- Each country may enter two swimmers in individual events and one team in each relay event.
- There is no limit of the number of events per swimmer.
- The swimming events will take place in a 50m pool which complies with FINA specifications.

- The pool will be available for use by competitors on the day before the first swimming event, or earlier by arrangement with the Organising Committee.
- Arrangements for allocation of lines and the timetable for practice will be made by the Organising Committee together with the ISF Technical Committee for Swimming.

10.4.3 Heats and Qualification for Finals

- According to the number of entries for each event, the Technical Commission will establish the time schedule for the programme and decide if qualifying heats are required. Qualifying heats will be arranged for all events. There will be a B final provided that the number of participants exceeds 11.
- Starting places will be determined according to FINA Law, using the times submitted on entry forms for qualifying heats and for finals where no qualifying heats are required. This will only apply to individual events. For relay events, seeding for places shall be decided by a random draw.
- Entry forms completed by the responsible authority for each country should contain the time of a performance recorded by the competitor during the previous 12 months in a pool of 50m.
Only performances established at official competitions, international events and national championships should be used for this purpose.
In accordance with FINA Law competitors for whom no time is submitted shall be considered the slowest and allocated places accordingly.
- Any record established during the events can be confirmed.

10.5 The Gymnasiade will be organised under ISF Regulations and within the Rules of the International Sports Federations concerned under the jurisdiction of the ISF Technical Commissions involved.

11. **PRIZES/CERTIFICATES**

- 11.1 Each participant will receive a commemorative certificate.
- 11.2 Participants placed first, second and third in the individual events will receive medals.
- 11.3 Teams placed first, second and third in the team events will receive medals.
